DRM488H1 / DRA3905H Snr Sem: Livestreaming with (DDL)2: Artistic and Professional Explorations of a Digital Media Challenge

Increasingly, theatre practitioners across specializations are asked to participate in online, web-based live stream performances and present creative ideas to festival programmers or employers. Our innovative course explores both critical discourses but also practices of live stream performance. Students will be building and practicing professional, creative and critical analytical skills, when conceptualizing and performing live-stream tasks. This includes critical writing, technical skills in terms of setup, the use of equipment (sound, light, camera, post-production), and representation strategies/performance. This is a project of Professor Budde's creative research hub Digital Dramaturgy Lab^{squared} or (DDL)², and is co-funded by the Provost's ITIF Fund and CDTPS.

Qualifications

A Master's degree in drama or theatre studies is required; senior Ph.D. candidates preferred. The successful candidate will have professional expertise in the field of digital media design and live-stream AV media production technology around which they hope to focus the course, and, preferably experience teaching senior undergraduates in these fields.

Duties

As a co-instructor, preparing and teaching DRM488H1 S/DRA3905H *Snr Sem: Livestreaming with (DDL)2: Artistic and Professional Explorations of a Digital Media Challenge* (Wednesdays 2pm - 5pm) from January 1st, 2020 to April 30th, 2020; using CIS and Quercus to post your course materials, assigning and marking papers and/or presentations, supervising student tests; holding regular office hours (2 hours weekly), and inputting final grades into Emarks.
