The Centre for Drama, Theatre and Performance seeks 1 Course Instructor for the following course:

DRM387H1 S –TOPICS: RACE, GENDER & PERFORMANCE

This online course will enable students to look at performance in generative new ways by introducing them to theoretical frameworks and critical perspectives from postcolonial theory and queer theory, critical race studies and gender studies. As well as learning to apply these critical tools to work that they are already familiar with, students will be introduced to work in feminist, queer, and anti-racist performance from outside of the mainstream.

Qualifications

Enrolled as a full-time doctoral student in Drama, Theatre and Performance Studies at the University of Toronto. ABD; Dissertation in an area relevant to the topics of the course (race, gender and performance). Minimum 50% of dissertation approved by supervisory committee. Previous teaching experience required.

Duties

Preparing course syllabus, planning and delivering online lectures, designing assignments, tests and examinations, grading, managing course content and grades on Quercus & CIS, holding office hours, invigilating tests and exams (if applicable), and supervising a teaching assistant (if applicable).
